Note: The Last Supper was not the Passover meal. At the Last Supper, only bread and wine is mentioned (not lamb); plus, the lamb would not attend his own meal! It is clear Jesus, as the Lamb of God, was sacrificed before the Passover meal. See John 13:1-2, 13:29 and 18:28 which specifically say the Feast (Passover meal) is yet future (and after the Last Supper).

Matthew then states 'Early the [next] morning' (Matt 21:18) Jesus goes back to city and curses the fig tree, which is Monday and is consistent with Mark 11. As such, it indicates that Jesus cleared the temple both Sunday and Monday.
